The last 25 miles, the route winds its way along the Nestucca River through the lush Coastal Range, and ultimately descends to the wetlands that lead to the Pacific Ocean.

Over 3,000 participants raised more than \$500,000. This was the 20th anniversary of this event.

The next event will be on May 21, 2011, with 4 different starting points: Portland (100 mi), Newberg (80 mi), Amity (55 mi) or Grand Ronde (28 mi). 
Highway Cleanup

Bike ride into History



CLUB

Timberline to Rhododendron - along ancient paths and old, abandoned roads



Saturday, September 18. 10 am. Get your ski legs in shape with an easy bike ride into history. We'll ride mainly on old, abandoned roads you never knew existed. But they are paved. It's all downhill from Timberline to Rhododendron, probably around 15 miles. Make sure your brakes are good.

We'll all assemble at 10 am in Rhododendron. Everyone should stop there. Half of us will leave our cars in Rhody, while the other half will give us all a ride up to Timberline. Those leaving their cars will carpool with those who are driving on. For the bikes (at least the half of them), we will have a special truck, graciously provided by Chas Westergren. Thanks, Chas!

Then the fun begins!

- * First, a downhill run down **West Leg Road**, the same road you usually ski on. The road is paved and open to traffic in the summer, but few people even know about it. The road invites fast riding. But, please note: This is NOT a race. The road is full of curves, which can be dangerous at high speed. So, let's stick together, stop to pick some huckleberries, and generally stay with the group.
- * You'll see part of the **Summit Ski area**, and part of the old **Glade Trail**, where an upside-down bus, called the SkiWay, used to transport skiers while travelling along fixed cables suspended above ground.
- * We'll ride through **Government Camp** and **Mt. Hood Skibowl**, which will be celebrating the history of Mt. Hood on this annual Heritage Day. There will be old vintage cars, a display of old photos, a huckleberry cooking contest, Wy'east Artisans show and sale, special food booths, live and silent auctions, and more. Consider this **just a "teaser"**. We won't stop. We'll continue the bike ride, but we can come back here later.
- * We'll ride through remote parts of **the old, abandoned highway 26**, the one that **President Roosevelt** used when he came to inaugurate Timberline Lodge.
- * We'll cross part of the new highway 26 that our club has recently **adopted** for cleanup. (We'll be back here for another highway cleanup on Saturday, October 9th.) You should at least know where it is.
- * See **Laurel Hill**, the steepest part of the old **Barlow Trail**, where the pioneers had to lower their wagons with ropes, and also drag a tree behind the wagon, to act as a brake.
- * Then comes a short portion of an unpaved path, leading through a "**bat cave**", a narrow and tall tunnel, designed to accommodate one **horse** at a time. This was built when horses were important to the US Cavalry.
- * We'll visit the **Little Zig Zag Falls**. Beautiful, relaxing area, shaded by tall trees.
- * We'll cycle down a paved but little used **Kiwanis Camp Road**. Remember this road. It will be mentioned again in future articles about skiing the back-country on Mt. Hood. Several hiking trails begin from this road.
- * **Road 31**. More **hidden back roads** that nobody ever uses. It's like a bicycle ride through a **hidden park**.

At the end of the day, we can stop for food and refreshments either in Rhododendron or in Government Camp, or go back to Skibowl for some fun, a zip-line ride through trees, the alpine slide, or some 30 other attractions.

So, get into that pioneer spirit, imagine what it was like before all these new highways were built, and explore some of the old and abandoned paths and roads. This is a very unique bike ride.

To participate, just show up in the supermarket parking lot in Rhododendron, at 10 am, on Saturday, September 18. But, it might help to know how many people to expect. So, let us know if you are coming. Contact Emilio, **Emilio2000@earthlink.net**, or call 503-378-0171.

Big White, Silver Star, Sun Peaks, Revelstoke, ... and more!



December 9-15, 2010 - A 5 or 6 day trip.

HIGH

This might be our last Canada Ski Safari (at least for a while). We have been doing this annual trip for the past 7 years (since Dec. 2003). During this time, some of us enjoyed a total of about 20 days of free skiing at some amazing resorts in British Columbia. Unfortunately, we were not able to entice many people to join us. Two years, we had about 12 people each time, but most years it was only between 2 and 6 people.

Lift tickets used to be totally free. This year, everyone who attends the Warren Miller film show receives 2-for-1 lift tickets to 3 Canadian resorts (Big White, Silver Star, and Sun Peaks). See: www.mthigh.org/index.htm#Warren Miller movie.



Let's use those 2-for-1 vouchers explore several Canadian ski resorts, Big White, Silver Star, and Sun Peaks. We'll also stop at Mt. Baker and Mission Ridge (in Washington) on the way there and back.

Our usual 5 -day trip can be extended to 6 days, to include a side-trip to Revelstoke Mt. Resort, the newest ski area in North America, and the one with the biggest vertical: 5,620 feet from top to bottom!

This is a road trip, and a great adventure, skiing a different ski area each day! The exact dates depend on the snow conditions and people's preferences. We are totally free to change our minds at a moment's notice and to follow where the best snow is. There are no reservations, no deposits, ... just pure fun of our own choosing.

Note that once we are in Canada, the ski areas are all about 2 - 2.5 hours drive from each other.

Here's the plan for this year's Safari. Click here to see a map.

DAY 0: Not counting this as a real day, because people can still work this day, and drive out of Portland after work. Just drive for about 4 or 5 hours, and spend the next day skiing at either Mission Ridge or Mt. Baker.

DAY 1: Most likely: Mt. Baker or Mission Ridge or Stevens Pass. Or maybe even Apex (B.C.)

DAY 2: Ski Big White, then 2 hrs.drive to Silver Star.

DAY 3: Ski <u>Silver Star</u>. After this, anyone who wants the shorter 5-day trip can drive to Sun Peaks, while those who prefer the 6-day option can go to Revelstoke. Either way is about 2.5 hours of driving.

DAY 4: Ski <u>Revelstoke Mt.</u>, a brand new ski resort, which has a total of 5,620 vertical feet, by far the largest vertical in North America. (Whistler/Blackcomb is 5,000'). Meanwhile, the shorter trip skis <u>Sun Peaks</u>.

DAY 5: The longer trip skis <u>Sun Peaks</u>. Meanwhile, the shorter trip group skis <u>Mt. Baker</u>, then drives home to Portland. End of the shorter trip.

DAY 6: The group on the longer trip skis Mt. Baker, then drives home to Portland. End of the longer trip.

This is a very informal trip. Just drive up, preferably carpool, and let's ski! If we share lodging and gas expenses, the trip can be quite affordable. In the past, we have spent anywhere between \$200 - \$350 per person for a 5 - 6 day trip. Of course, that was when ALL the lift tickets were free. Expect to spend a bit more this year. But, it will still be less expensive than most other ski trips.

No deposits or down-payments required. It's all pay as you go. No reservations are needed, or even possible, because Big White and Silver Star have a 2-night minimum requirement, but they will not turn us down if we just show up. This has never been a problem. The only thing you need for this trip is a **passport**!

Mt. High Snoqualmie, Alpental, Mission Ridge & Stevens Pass + Leavenworth!



January 27-30, 2011

3 days/3 nights. The bus trips are usually our club's best and most fun events. We will leave Thursday around 5 pm, and return Sunday night. We'll visit:

1. **The Summit at Snoqualmie.** For this trip, we are taking one extra "work" day off in order to ski Snoqualmie, which is the closest area to Seattle and gets slammed on weekends. The club has never had a trip to this area before. There are 4 separate base areas, Snoqualmie East, West, Central, plus Alpental - which is for advanced skiers. A total of 33 lifts, including 2 that are new for this year. There is something for everyone, and we might want to plan a full weekend trip here in the future. Be among the first in our club to ski here!



- 2. **Mission Ridge**. 2,250' vertical. 1 Express Quad, 3 Doubles. You can ski by a World War II bomber that crashed on the mountain!
- 3. **Stevens Pass**, lots of tree skiing, front and back + lots of cruisers! 1,800' vertical on 3 sides of 2 different mountains, served by 3 Quads, 4 Triples, 3 Doubles.

Lodging: The first night we will cut our driving time short and stay at the I-90 Inn in Ellensburg, only 45 minutes from Snoqualmie. The next 2 nights nights we'll stay in the charming town of Leavenworth. We have booked almost the entire Obertal Inn, right in the middle of Leavenworth, just for us! Most rooms have 2 queen beds, some have 1 king bed. There are also 2 Fireplace Suites and 2 Jacuzzi Suites. If a couple wants to book one of those suites, each **person** would pay an extra \$25 for a Fireplace Suite or \$45 for a Jacuzzi Suite. First come, first served. Reserve yours soon! An "expanded continental breakfast" is included.

Price: \$375 for transportation, 3 nights' lodging, continental breakfasts, and 3 days lift tickets. Senior discounts will be announced later.

Use the <u>Dough Transmittal form</u> on page 13 (or on our FORMS web page) to send \$100 deposit, due by November 11. Full payment due by December 31. NOTE: Only 44 spots available at the standard rate. After those 44 spots get filled, you'll only be able to sign up for the more expensive rooms (double occupancy only).

Crystal Mountain, WA



March 25-27, 2011

A weekend bus trip, 2 nights/2 days. We leave Friday around 5:00 pm. Lots of fun on the bus – this is the best way to get to know other club members! We'll return Sunday by 8 pm.



Crystal Mountain is the largest ski area in Washington with 3,100 vertical feet of skiing, with over 50 named runs. There's everything from gentle groomed cruising runs for beginners to challenging steeps - backcountry, glades, chutes and unbelievable black runs for the more adventurous. This is why SKIING Magazine voted Crystal Mountain the #7 top mountain in North America.



There are 2 six-pack hi-speed lifts, 2 hi-speed quads, 2 triples, and 4 doubles. Also, NEW since our last trip to Crystal Mountain in 2009 is the Mt. Rainier Gondola. With travel time of less than 10 minutes (half the time of the current two chairlifts) and a vertical rise of nearly 2,500 feet, the gondola will provide year-round lift access to Crystal Mountain's summit. In addition to providing warm, dry uphill transport, the gondola also serves as backup when the Rainier Express is not able to serve the summit elevations due to high winds.

There are now 2,300 acres of lift served terrain, plus 500 acres of backcountry.

We'll stay at the Park Center Hotel in downtown Enumclaw, 45 minutes from the mountain, with easy access to a variety of restaurants and bars. Breakfast is provided for hotel guests, and there is an indoor hot tub.

The price is only \$199 for the bus trip, 2 nights' lodging, 2 breakfasts, and one lift ticket.

The reason for only one lift ticket is that on Sunday, March 27, Crystal Mountain is allowing all NWSCC club members to buy tickets at half price, but you have to go to the ticket window yourself and show your NWSCC card (i.e. your club membership card; you'll get it when you renew your club membership for 2010-2011).
