

Idaho bike trip

September 2 - 5, 2011. We spent 3 days riding the 72-mile Trail of the Coeur d'Alenes, from the town of Mullan (near the Montana border) to the town of Plummer (south of Coeur d'Alene). The paved bicycle trail passes through Historic Wallace, Kellogg, Enaville, Cataldo, and Harrisson. It follows the Coeur d'Alene river and then hugs the shores of Lake Couer d'Alene, and over the stair-step Chatcolet bridge, designed to make it easier for cyclists to cross over it.

A good portion of the trail passes through wilderness with marshes and lily ponds, where you can see egrets, osprey, grebes and other wildlife. Some said they saw turtles and a large snake. There are plenty of moose in the area, and we saw lots of muddy moose tracks crossing the bike trail, but did not see any moose.

Sacajawea Heritage Trail




Ski to Defeat ALS Kickoff

Mt. Hood Skibowl hasn't announced its prices yet. but here's a preliminary comparison. Note that most passes will be more expensive after November 6. The Fusion PAss is a good deal, less expensive than a purely Timberline pass only. It's a no-brainer: get both Timberline and Skibowl for less than the price of just one of them!

But consider how many days you will really be skiing in a season? If it's only 8 - 12 days, then a 10-time pass would be the best deal.
