


Ski Fair




How to wax and tune up your ski or board

Thanks to Linda Mc-Gavin, who is currently working on the next NW Skiers' Directory, we found this deal from Mt. Bachelor offered to all NW ski clubs, This replaces last year's "Club Card".

- 1. **For the general public:** There was only a 4-day window to purchase the 4-Pack, October 7 10.
- 2. For NWSCC club members (That's all of us!) We can still purchase the 4-pack until December 15, and it's best to do it at The Ski Fair on Nov. 7. Plus, we also get a free demo rental thrown in! Here are the details:

Mt. Bachelor is offering a new 4-Pack product for the upcoming 2011/12 winter season. The 4-Pack includes four full-day lift tickets priced at a significantly reduced rate of \$169, or \$42.25 per day, a savings of over 40% off the lead 1-day lift ticket rate of \$73. The 4-Pack provides the best value for less frequent skiers and snowboarders to access the largest resort in the Cascades during the upcoming winter season.

An **eight-person gondola** connecting **The Canyons** ski area (near Park City) to **Solitude** in Big Cottonwood Canyon. At this stage, it is just an idea being explored, ... but remember: you heard it here first!

They'll pick you up from any of our designated pick up locations in Tualatin, Beaverton, and Gateway in one of their luxury motorcoach buses and deliver you right to the main lodge! Park & Ride will run on weekends and holidays through-out the season. Bus trip





January 20 - 22, 2012.

2 days/ 2 nights. A fun bus trip. Leave Friday at 5pm. Return Sunday night.

Anthony Lakes is the ski area with the highest base in Oregon, at 7,000' so the snow is guaranteed and the powder light & dry.

Lodging: The first night we will stay at the Indian casino near Pendleton. You will have time to gamble away some of your money!!! The next morning we'll drive straight to the ski area.

The second night, we'll stay at the El Dorado hotel in Baker City, the town closest to Anthony Lakes.

Dinner: When we come back from skiing on Saturday we'll change and load up on the bus again for a very special dinner at the Haines Steak House, the best for miles around. Your dinner and soft drinks are included, with a choice of prime rib, BBQ pork ribs, or halibut, as well as the fabulous salad bar. Appetizers, desserts, or alcoholic beverages are on your own. Vegetarians or light eaters who just want the salad bar will pay \$10 less for the trip.

Skiing: Sunday morning we will load up the bus to go ski at Anthony Lakes.

Update on snowcat skiing: Weather and snow conditions permitting, Anthony Lakes will offer our group half days of snowcat skiing on either Saturday or Sunday for only \$60 additional! This should allow anyone on our trip who is interested to participate on one of the two days. Linda McGavin is taking names of those interested, but no payment will be made until the time of the trip, when we are certain that they will be able to offer the snowcat (they usually start about that time of year). A total of 12 people can sign up on any one day, and we will need to let Anthony Lakes know how many extra spots they could sell to the public. So get your name in early to be on the list!





Trip Price: \$230 for transportation, 2 nights' lodging, and 2 days lift tickets.

Utah: Powder Mt. & Snowbasin

Drive or fly = *



Feb. 18 - 24, 2012 Take your pick: a short or a long trip.

SHORT: Feb 18-22: 4 nights/ 2 lift tix included, optional 3rd-4th day. Price: **\$299**. LONG: Feb 18-25: 7 nights/ 4 lift tix included, optional 5th-6th day. Price: **\$494**.

There is a lot of flexibility in this trip. You can decide to drive to Utah (and maybe visit a few more ski areas along the way). Or you can fly to Salt Lake City and rent a car there.

Sat., Feb 18, is travel day. We'll start skiing Sunday. Last day of the trip, you will either spend the day driving home, or ski one more day and catch an evening flight home.

Lodging: We'll stay in Eden, 15 minutes from Powder Mt. and 1:15 from the Salt Lake City airport. Lodging is in "Moose Hollow" condos. These are 3-bedroom condos, with 2 people per bedroom, and a total of 5 to 6 people per condo.

Lift tickets: Included are Powder Mt. and Snowbasin lift tickets. People on the short trip will get 1 lift ticket to each ski area (total of 2). People on the longer trip will get 2 lift tickets to each ski area (total of 4).

Powder Mt. offers 2,000' vertical 5,500 acres, 1 express quad, 1 fixed quad, 1 triple, 1 double chair, 1 snowcat.

Snowbasin was the location of the Olympic Downhill in 2002, luxurious new lodges, 2,959' vertical. 2,800 acres,, 1 tram, 2 gondolas, 1 quad, 4 triples. Both ski areas offer not only powder but also long cruisers!

Also, you will be able to ski at least one or two other ski areas around Salt Lake City (among the 8 available).

Transportation is not included. Drive your own car or fly and rent a car. You will need preferably a 4-wheel drive car to get to the town of Eden, Utah, and also to the ski areas. From Eden, there is a shuttle bus to Powder Mt. (15 min. drive), but no shuttles to Snowbasin (20 min. drive). Other ski areas are 1.0 - 1.5 hours away.

Here are some ideas offering additional flexibility:

Idea 1: For a quick in and out, fly in and fly out. Southwest Airlines has one-way tickets for just \$107 (Portland to Salt Lake City). You can use your own points on your own preferred airline.

Idea 2: For a more adventurous approach, drive your own car from Portland, stay just 4 days in Utah, and then ski your way back home, stopping at 2 or 3 other ski areas along the way, such as **Pomerelle** (Idaho), **Bogus Basin** (Idaho), and **Anthony Lakes** (Oregon). Or, if you've already been to A-Lakes (on our January bus trip), then select between **Spout Springs** (Oregon) and **Bluewood** (WA). Wow! A mini ski safari on the way back home! At least some of us are planning to do this.





Better than Gore-Tex

Breathe Easy Rab Stretch Neo Jacket with Polartec NeoShell (left) versus Millet Trilogy Limited GTX with Gore-Tex Active Shell (right) -- by Jeff Harris

For 35 years, Gore-Tex has

dominated the market for waterproof, breathable fabrics, but this spring it has some competition. Textile maker Polartec has developed its own waterproof, breathable fabric that threatens to trump Gore-Tex's latest. Both were put to the test.

The Tech

1. Rab Stretch Neo Jacket with Polartec NeoShell

Under a microscope, NeoShell's permeable layer looks like spiderwebs spun from a polyurethane thread. The webs form tiny channels large enough that humid air can escape but small enough that water droplets (even those with the force of a 10-

foot waterfall) can't get in. A polyester lining and durable outer-face fabric sandwich the layer and are fused to it with pinhead-size dots of adhesive, keeping channels clear and air flowing. The Rab Stretch Neo Jacket at Rab costs \$365.

2. Millet Trilogy Limited GTX w/ Gore-Tex Active Shell Thinner and lighter than its predecessor, Gore-Tex's Active Shell fabric features a porous membrane that looks like cotton candy up close. The fabric bonds directly with a moisture-wicking lining, eliminating a heavy layer of adhesive and trimming a few ounces off the jacket. An outer-face fabric attaches with microscopic glue dots; this way, the pores (about nine billion of themper square inch) don't get gummed up. The Millet Trilogy Limited GTX jacket at Millet is \$400.

The Test: For one month this winter, four testers wore both jackets while skiing front- and backcountry in the mountains of Vermont, Colorado and Utah. Conditions ranged from snow squalls to bright sunshine, and temperatures varied from close to freezing to as low as -30° F.

The Results: All four testers felt consistently more comfortable in the 17-ounce Polartec shell, despite the Gore-Tex's jacket being 3 ounces heavier. Testers had to physically air out the Gore-Tex jacket by unzipping its armpit vents, whereas sweat evaporated quickly out of the ventless Polartec. **Winner:** Polartec NeoShell
