Don McPherson Passed Away

Don McPherson, our club member whom many of us knew from PACRAT racing, passed away from a brain tumor on September 5, 2012, at the age of 61.

He was born in Salem, OR, attended Salem High School, and graduated from BYU in 1975. On his **Facebook page**, he says: "I was an instructor for BYU in their desert survival program for 5 terms. That was the happiest time of my whole life."

He was a carpenter and owned his own construction company for 23 years, framing houses in Edmonton, Alberta. He returned to Oregon in 1992. His last job was as a real estate broker in Lake Oswego. He had 5 children.

He enjoyed skiing. He participated in the Oregon Cancer Ski Out. He was also a PACRAT racer. He ended his last season of racing (2010/2011) very successfully. In his last race, he won first place in the Intermediate category by improving on his own best previous time and thus earning the 3 bonus points, as well as an upstrike that might have sent him into the Advanced category.



He signed up for the 2011/2012 season of racing on the Drooling Moose Rats team, but his health deteriorated and he was not able to attend any of the races.

Don loved spending good times with his friends and family. He was always appreciated for his sense humor and always seized the opportunity to laugh at himself.

Mt. Ashland expansion approved

On August 17, 2012, judge **Owen Panner** lifted the injuction against construction activities at Mt. Ashland. The ski area now has approval to add new ski runs, 2 ski lifts, and expand the parking lot. **Rick Saul**, who has been the ski area's Marketing Director has been appointed Development Director.

New runs and a new lift will be added to the north of the existing area, beyond the Bowl, and to skier's left of the Caliban trail.

White Pass doubled in size

White Pass ski area in Washington has doubled its terrain last year, with the addition of 767 acres in Paradise Basin, served by 2 new lifts. Also, a new on mountain lodge has been built, serving breakfast and lunch 7 days a week.

White Pass also installed an RFID ticketing system, similar to Mt. Hood Meadows.

49° North Gets Bigger & Better

49° North Mountain Resort , north of Spokane, has purchased a doublechairlift for Angel Peak which will be ready for operation at the start of the 2012-2013 winter season. The new chairlift will be 4,336' long, spanning 1,144 vertical feet to the top of Angel Peak.

In the summer of 2013, the Mid-Mountain Lodge will be built. with 4,800 square feet located at the top of the Blastface and Silver Ridge trail junction, overlooking the Pend Oreille Valley and the Sunrise Basin Quad chairlift. The lodge will be three stories high with easy access from Silver Ridge, a heated deck, a meeting area, restrooms, a dining area with in-floor heating, and a first aid room.

Lift tickets and Season Passes

Highlighted in **yellow** are the new lift ticket prices for this coming winter. **Skibowl** and **Timberline** have not published their prices yet, so the prices below are from last year (just for a ballpark figure). Timberline promises to publish their prices after October 12, and Skibowl just says "Coming soon". Fortunately, the Fusion Pass gives you both of these two ski areas for one price, and Fusion prices have been published a month ago.

Most passes will cost more after November 4. Exception: At the Ski Fair, Nov. 5, the Meadows 10-time pass will cost just \$379 (instead of \$419).

Which pass is best for you depends on how much you'll ski.

Also, remember that all ski areas will be offering **Spring Passes** valid for March, April and May. Consider maybe a 5-day pass plus a Spring Pass, and they don't have to be at the same ski area.

The single day lift ticket at **Mt. Hood Meadows** has gone up to \$89 on peak days (weekends and holidays). Mid-week lift tickets will be \$74. At these daily prices, a Season Pass is a good deal even if you only ski a total of 6 days in the whole season. **Everyone needs a new photo this year.**

RFID Gates

Mt. Hood Meadows is introducing new RFID tickets and gates this winter. These tickets use radio frequencies to be detected by the gate. You just keep your ticket on the left side of your body and the gate will open as you approach.

Everyone will need a new RFID pass this year, but you can use your old picture they have on file. You will have to get the passes in person – ski shows, REI, Meadows office or at the Resort.

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Trip signups

Q: How do I sign up for a trip, and when is the best time to do it?

A: Now is the best time. The earlier the better. At least put down a deposit, to reserve a spot.

Many people think that our Kickoff Party in November is only the first of many opportunities to sign up for a trip. But, in reality, the Kickoff Party is the **last** opportunity, because some trips fill up very soon after that.

We prepare our winter trips in July. We start advertising them in Lift Lines and on the web site as early as July or August. There are only 5 opportunities for us to display trip flyers at club events, and they are:

1) Picnic in August.

- 2) Seafood Party in September
- 3) Warren Miller dinner, October
- 4) Ski Fair in November.
- 5) Kickoff Party in November.

After that, we start skiing, and there aren't any more social events.

Also, some trips, like the Far West Ski Week, are usually mostly booked up by now. Also, for any early trips in December or January, we need to release any unfilled rooms 30 days before the trip (or 60 days for Utah).

For any Mountain High trip, please use our **Dough Transmittal form** to indicate what you are paying for, and mail your check to the club's PO Box on the form.

For NWSCC or FWSA trips, please send your check to the address indicated in the trip announcement.


Club meetings


If there are enough of us at any of
