Timberline Adventures





Powder Alliance Trip to Whitewater (BC) and Schweitzer Mt. (ID)

February 25 - March 4, 2017.

Approximately 48 people participated in this trip, most of them on the bus but also two couples driving their own cars. The participants were a mixed group of Mountain High people, Mt. Hood Ski Kats, and Bergfreunde club members. Our trip leader was **Karen Michels**.

On the first day, we rode our chartered bus to the charming town of Nelson, British Columbia. We had excellent fresh and dry snow at Whitewater (BC), where we skied the first 3 days. The snow was so light that several people tried skiing in ungroomed snow and trees for the first time.

By the time we moved to Sandpoint, Idaho and skied on Schweitzer Mountain, temperatures had warmed up somewhat and the ungroomed snow was heavier and wetter, but the groomers were good. We had low clouds at Schweitzer all three days, which meant skiing through fog when crossing from the front to the back of the mountain, where there was much less fog.

There was a lot of terrain to explore and everyone had a good time. We'll revisit both Whitewater and Schweitzer again some time in the near future.

Mt. Hood Fusion Pass & Powder Alliance Alternative for 70-year olds

You can save money with the Fusion Pass. In the past 2 or 3 winters, our club trips have skied at places where you can use the Fusion Pass to ski for free.

With the Fusion Pass, you get not only unlimited skiing at both Timberline and Mt. Hood Skibowl,

but you also get 3 free days at each of about a dozen other ski areas that are members of the Powder Alliance.

You can buy your Fusion Pass online, starting at: www.mthoodfusionpass.com, but you will still need to eventu-

ally have your picture taken and pick up your pass at Timberline or Skibowl.

The cost of the Fusion Pass depends on your age:

1. Adult, age 25-64: \$499 2. Young adult, 15-24: \$349 3. Junior, 7 - 14: \$249 4. Senior, 65-70:

But here is an alternative if you don't ski much at Timberline or Skibowl but would like to get the benefits of the Powder Alliance deal. Get a Season Pass at Stevens Pass, and you can use it as a Powder Alliance Pass.

There's just one catch. You have to be:

Exactly 70: If you don't plan on skiing at Timberline and Skibowl more than 3 times each, but you want the Powder Alliance benefits, you can buy the **Premium season pass** at

Stevens Pass for about \$129. Stevens Pass is part of the Powder Alliance.

Super-seniors, 71+: You can get the local Fusion Pass for free, but it won't be valid outside of Mt. Hood. To get the full Powder Alliance privileges, the Fusion Pass will cost you \$50.

Solar Eclipse coming to Oregon



red line shows the location of the longest lasting eclipse. The eclipse will last only a few seconds near the blue lines. So, the best viewing will be in places like Depoe Bay, Salem, Albany, Warm Springs and Madras.


Portland, Eugene and Bend will only see a partial eclipse, which is just a fading of the sun, not much.

Plan to come closer to Salem to see the real thing. That's when you can briefly see the sun's corona streaming outward.

The moon's shadow will race across Oregon in just 12 minutes at the speed of 3,400 miles per hour.

August 21, 2017. Get ready for an astronomical treat. A very rare event will happen in Oregon on Monday, August 21, 2017. It's a solar eclipse, when the moon gets exactly between the Earth and the Sun. The moon will block the sun's rays for about **2 minutes**. The full eclipse will start in Salem, OR at **10:18 am**. Some general effects, such as a gradual fading of the sun, will be noticeable about 30 minutes earlier.

The total eclipse will be visible only along a narrow path. The moon will cast a shadow only 87 miles wide, as shown by the blue lines on the map. The

Mid-week skiing



Most of our Midweek skiers ski at Mt. Hood Meadows. (though some ski at Timberline & Skibowl). The Meadows group tends to be

advanced and fast skiers.

Some carpool up from the Safeway in Sandy at 7 am, but your best bet to find the group is when they are at the tables in the cafeteria area about 20 - 30 minutes before the lifts open (which is at 9 am).

It's best to arrange meeting others through the <u>Midweek forum</u>, a Google group accessible from our web site.

2-way Radios

A few years ago, we spent a whole day skiing through fog at Schweitzer Mt. The next day started foggy too. One of our club members stayed in the lodge, looking through the window, waiting to see if the fog would disperse.

The rest of us got on the chairlift and by the time we reached the first tower the fog was gone, replaced by pure sunshine. Pity we couldn't communicate with our friend in the lodge, because he didn't have a radio and we didn't know his cell phone number.

It happened again during the recent Mystery trip. Mt. Spokane was in thick fog. We were



told that the back side is usually less foggy, so we went there. Sure enough, no fog. We tried to communicate with people who had stayed in the day lodge, but there was no cell phone reception, and nobody in the lodge had a radio. Everyone with a radio was skiing on the back side.

For group communications on the slopes, there is nothing better than 2-way radios. Cell phones don't always have a good signal, and even when they do, you can only communicate with one person at a time.

Our club uses radio channel 6 code 19. Don't miss out. Get yourself a radio. It's just \$30 – \$65 for a set of 2 radios at REI.



Mission Ridge + Stevens Pass

March 17-19, 2017 - 2 days/ 2 nights. THIS TRIP IS NOW FULL

Maximum 48 people on the bus; but you can drive if bus is full, if you want to bring your family, or if you are coming from another city.

The bus trips are usually our club's best and most fun events. We'll leave Friday at 3 pm, and return Sunday night by 9:00 -9:30 pm. We'll visit:

1. **Mission Ridge**. 2,250' vertical. 1 Express Quad, 3 Doubles. You can ski by a World War II bomber that crashed on the mountain. Get a 15% dining discount by showing your group lift ticket.

2. **Stevens Pass**, lots of tree skiing, front and back + lots of cruisers! 1,800' vertical on 3 sides of 2 different mountains, served by 3 Quads, 4 Triples, 3 Doubles.

Lodging: The charming town of Leavenworth feels like it's always Christmas there! We have booked almost the entire Obertal Inn, right in the middle of Leavenworth. An "expanded continental breakfast" is included. The breakfast room and the menu have been expanded, now including an egg dish every day. Most rooms have 2 queen beds, though there are a few king rooms too. The Obertal has 3 stories with no elevator. In addition, we have booked three 2 bedroom/2-1/2 bath fully equipped townhomes directly across the street.



The townhomes have one king master suite, one queen bedroom with bath in the hall, and a sleeper sofa downstairs with a half bath (that person has to shower upstairs). We can put 5 people in a townhome with one person on a sleeper at no additional pp cost (\$20 price reduction for the person sleeping on the sofa bed); for more privacy, if you want 4 in a townhome add \$30 pp for 4 people.

All people staying in townhomes have to agree to stay together; we will not assign people who don't know each other into that setting. There is an additional 3 bedroom/2 bath townhome a block away. Breakfasts will not be included for the people staying there.

Two dinners included! The club will provide a Bavarian Banquet Dinner at the Andreas Keller Restaurant in Leavenworth on Saturday night (drinks, appetizers, and alcoholic beverages on your own).

How do WE and our CLUB benefit?

Mountain High Board of Directors has voted to reimburse club members who attend the convention as full voting delegates up to \$600 to be divided among the registered attendees. In addition, there are other incentives that will come directly back to Mountain High. These include:

Far West is offering the 6-pack incentive again this year, if we register before May 8, 2017. This offer provides 1 free registration (\$159) with every 6 paid. The reimbursement comes AFTER the convention. So, if we send 6, we'd get back \$159. If we send 12, we'd get back \$308. If we get enough delegates from our club, the club would receive this reimbursement, and the Board would decide how best to use it: split it up among the delegates, or use for a future club event.
