Multitasking Fun

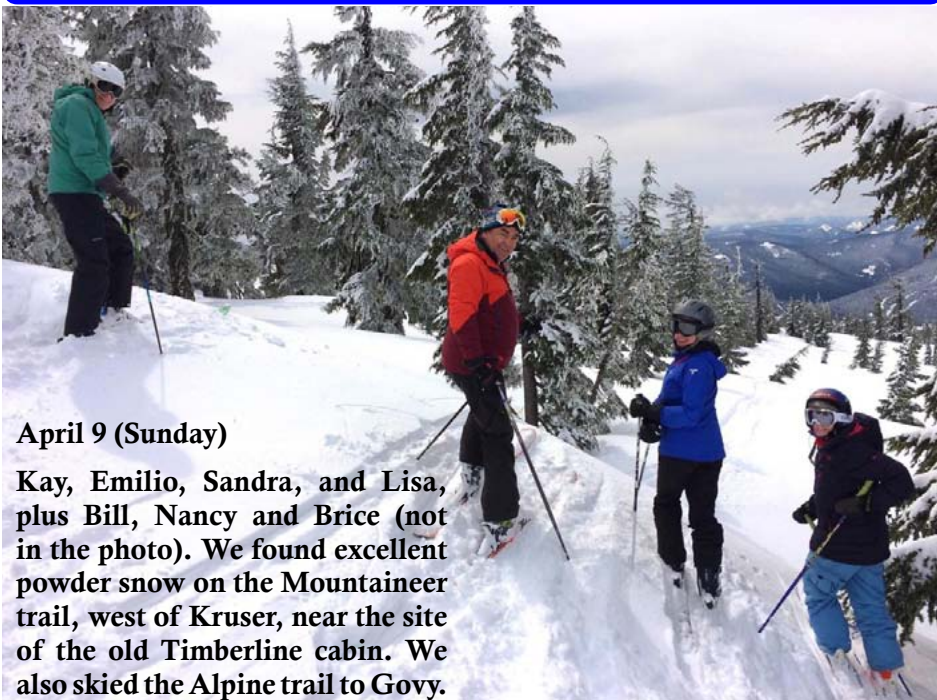
A lot of activities are happening on some of the same days. Combine two of them and double your pleasure. For example:

Leavenworth Trip to Mission Ridge and Stevens Pass

March 17-19, 2017.

We have done this trip several times before in previous years, so this time, the bus was only about half full, which gave everyone plenty of room to spread out and be comfortable.

In **Leavenworth**, after checking into our hotel, the Obertal Inn, some of us visited with **John and Jewel Andrew**, and heard from John about his latest skiing adventures in the Peace River valley in Alberta, and also in Alaska. On Saturday, we skied at **Mission Ridge**. We hardly felt any wind on the slopes, but there were gusts of high wind at the top of the mountain, which prevented the main Liberator Express chair from running almost all day, which was very unusual. They finally opened that lift around 2 pm, so at least some of us got at least one ride on it to the top and saw the remains of the wing from an old B-24 bomber that crashed into the mountain in 1944, while on a training mission. Thankfully, there was plenty of terrain served by the other chairlifts, and even chair 4 was open.

On Saturday evening, we had a group dinner at the **Andreas Keller** restaurant in Leavenworth. Everyone agreed the food and service there was excellent, better than at King Ludwig's where we had dined at on previous trips to Leavenworth.

Sunday, we skied at **Stevens Pass**, in beautiful sunny weather. This time, we spread out all over the mountain, skiing in smaller groups, and we hardly ever bumped into each other. 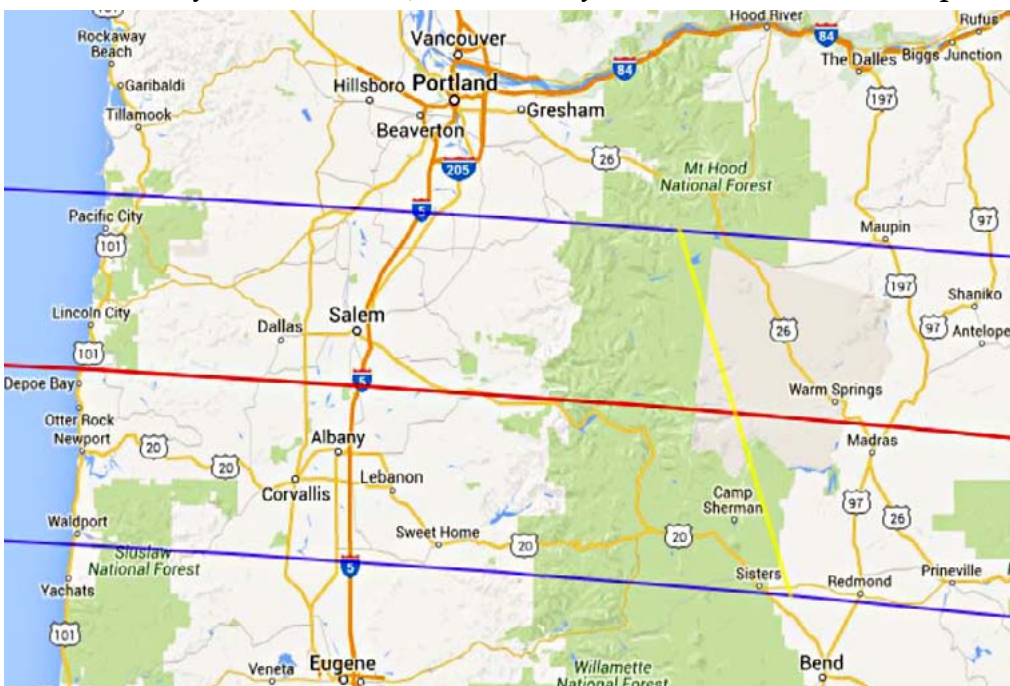

Solar Eclipse coming to Oregon

August 21, 2017. Get ready for an astronomical treat. A very rare event will happen in Oregon on Monday, August 21, 2017. It's a solar eclipse, when the moon gets exactly between the Earth and the Sun. The moon will block the sun's rays for about **2 minutes**. The full eclipse will start in Salem, OR at **10:18 am**. Some general effects, such as a gradual fading of the sun, will be noticeable about 30 minutes earlier.

The total eclipse will be visible only along a narrow path. The moon will cast a shadow only 87 miles wide, as shown by the blue lines on the map. The



red line shows the location of the longest lasting eclipse. The eclipse will last only a few seconds near the blue lines. So, the best viewing will be in places like Depoe Bay, Salem, Albany, Warm Springs and Madras.

Portland, Eugene and Bend will only see a partial eclipse, which is just a fading of the sun, not much.

Plan to come closer to Salem to see the real thing. That's when you can briefly see the sun's corona streaming outward.

The moon's shadow will race across Oregon in just 12 minutes at the speed of 3,400 miles per hour.

2-way Radios

A few years ago, we spent a whole day skiing through fog at Schweitzer Mt. The next day started foggy too. One of our club members stayed in the lodge, looking through the window, waiting to see if the fog would disperse.

The rest of us got on the chairlift and by the time we reached the first tower the fog was gone, replaced by pure sunshine. Pity we couldn't communicate with our friend in the lodge, because he didn't have a radio and we didn't know his cell phone number.

It happened again during the recent Mystery trip. Mt. Spokane was in thick fog. We were



told that the back side is usually less foggy, so we went there. Sure enough, no fog. We tried to communicate with people who had stayed in the day lodge, but there was no cell phone reception, and nobody in the lodge had a radio. Everyone with a radio was skiing on the back side.

For group communications on the slopes, there is nothing better than 2-way radios. Cell phones don't always have a good signal, and even when they do, you can only communicate with one person at a time.

Our club uses **radio channel 6 code 19**. Don't miss out. Get yourself a radio. It's just \$30 - \$65 for a set of 2 radios at REI.

What Happens at a Far West Convention?

Events include a **silent auction** on Friday Night, and the **Travel Expo** (where delegates meet one-on-one with resort personnel to plan future trips) on Saturday morning. Attend **educational leadership panel sessions** such as Improving Social Media savvy and the latest equipment, meet and greet with **ski personalities** like Billy Kidd and Charlie Linville, and attend the **awards banquet and dance** on Saturday night. There will be a business meeting on Sunday, at which time officers are elected, and other Association business takes place, as well as a sponsored Brunch, and LOTS of door prizes to be given away. All of these events (and meals!) are included in your registration fee.

Also available (for an additional fee) are optional events such as the Michael German Memorial Golf Tournament, Rafting on Payette River, Wine Wobble & Pub Crawl, A Day on the Mountain, and Boise Greenbelt & Nature Center Biking.

How do WE and our CLUB benefit?

Mountain High Board of Directors has voted to reimburse club members who attend the convention as full voting delegates up to \$600 to be divided among the registered attendees. In addition, there are other incentives that will come directly back to Mountain High. These include:

Far West is offering the 6-pack incentive again this year, if we register before May 8, 2017. This offer provides 1 free registration (\$159) with every 6 paid. The reimbursement comes **AFTER** the convention. So, if we send 6, we'd get back \$159. If we send 12, we'd get back \$308. If we get enough delegates from our club, the club would receive this reimbursement, and the Board would decide how best to use it: split it up among the delegates, or use for a future club event.

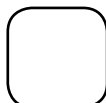
