2-Way Radios

On the mountain, use a 2-way radio to connect with us on channel **6-19**. That's channel 6, code 19. Just ask for any Mountain High members. If nobody answers, maybe they forgot to turn their radios on. Try again a half hour later.

But don't be surprised if there is no answer at all. For some reason, fewer of us carry a radio these days. People think that a cell phone is enough. But a cell phone doesn't always have a signal. Also, you cannot communicate with a whole group of people by phone.

A radio broadcasts your message to everyone in your group.

Some people may have bad memories of using 2-way radios some 10 - 20 years ago, when there was a lot of chatter from strangers on the radio. But there is no more chatter on the airwaves these days. It's just us.

Ribbons



We are still looking for the best way to identify our club members on the slopes. We might eventually print some flags with our club's

logo and affix them to our ski poles.

But for now, let's use a simple solution. Let's tie some orange ribbons to our ski poles. If you don't have any orange color, red or yellow will work too.

This is especially useful for our new club members. When you see someone with colorful ribbons tied to their ski poles, feel free to approach them and ask if they are members of the Mountain High Snowsport Club.

If you don't want to be approached by other members, don't tie a ribbon to your ski pole. If you do have one, it's an implied invitation to people to come ski with you.

When and Where to Find Us

In addition to the times listed below, our members ski at other times too. The 2 groups mentioned below are the most visible. We need to hear more from weekend skiers at Meadows and mid-week skiers at Timberline and Skibowl. Use our two Forums and our Facebook page to communicate with others.

Weekends at Timberline or Skibowl



Come ski with us! Just for fun. Can you show us some new trail. a secret stash, a hidden slope? Or can we show you something new you haven't

skied before? Let's find out. Usually on Saturdays.

Please drive up early. The parking lots fill up by about 7:30 or 7:45 am, 1.5 hours before the lifts open. Crazy, but that's how it is. Drive up, park, and then snooze or have breakfast in the car.

There are no long lift lines at Timberline, even when the parking lots are full. That's because Timberline's lift capacity far exceeds their parking lot capacity.

Meet a few minutes before 9 am, all dressed up and ready to go skiing. At Timberline, meet near the slope-side day lodge exit, next to the free ski check.

At Skibowl, meet on the back side of the cafeteria building, not far from the bottom of the stairs.

Midweek at Mt. Hood Meadows



A group of us go skiing at Mt. Hood Meadows on week days, all winter, usually on Thursdays, or whenever there is good powder.

At Meadows, find us in the cafeteria in the South lodge

near the Schuss restaurant on the slope level, 2nd floor. If we are not allowed in the lodge, then meet **near the top of the steps, usually at a ski rack on the right** where we would rest our skis & just hang out around 8:15-8:30 am.

Ski Trips

March 13 - 20, 2022. 4, 5, or 7 nights - by train, car, or plane.

Whitefish Mountain Resort offers 3000 acres of skiing on all sides of Big Mountain. It has 11 chair lifts (3 express quads). It has 2,353 vertical feet and 105 named runs plus vast amounts of bowl and tree skiing.

This will be a flexible, arrange your own transportation trip. Amtrak runs overnight from Portland or Vancouver to Whitefish and return. Current prices



start as low as \$79 per person each way reserved coach. There are a limited number of sleeper berths available. If you prefer to drive, it is a ten-hour drive, and you can stop to ski at other places along the way.

We will be staying at the **Kandahar Lodge**, a very nice onmountain hotel with a Swiss or

Austrian feel. The lobby/great room has a huge fireplace, an award-winning restaurant open only for dinner, and a small separate bar. There is no elevator. All the rooms are on the 2nd and 3rd floors.

It has a free van that will take you where you want to go on the mountain (not into town, there's a free public snow bus for that). The van only runs during the day. At night it's less than a five-minute walk to the bars and restaurants in the upper village, or to catch the snow bus into town.

You can ski-in but would have to walk 50 yards across a parking lot to ski out to a lift. Or take the free van.

For those traveling by train:

- * You will spend 2 nights on the train. The first and the last. You can sleep in the reclining seats, but it is highly recommended to ask for a sleeper car.
- * The train leaves Portland at 4:45 pm the day before and travels through the night. You need to reserve a ticket for March 12.
- * Train arrives in Whitefish early in the morning (at 7:41 am), and you can go skiing right away, after leaving your luggage in Kandahar lodge.
- * The train leaves Whitefish late in the evening, at 8:56 pm. You can ski all day and still have time for dinner in town before boarding the train home.

Price includes:

Free European-style continental breakfast, après ski cookies, freshly made popcorn, hot chocolate, coffee, and tea. Heated boot rooms and ski rooms. Free Wi-Fi, laundry, 24-hour front desk, large outdoor jacuzzi, steam room, and fitness center. Massages are available by appointment. All rooms have at least a small refrigerator and microwave. Some rooms have small kitchens; those will be assigned on a first-come first-served basis.

We have reserved all rooms for 7 nights from March 13 - 20, 2022, but we will also be able to offer either 4- or 5-night stays.

Because we will receive the 7th night comped, 6-night pricing will be the same as 7-night. To make things manageable & simplify matching of roommates, All 4-night and 5-night stays must begin on March 13.

We will do our best to match you with a roommate who wants the same nights as you, but you are ultimately responsible for finding a roommate who wants the same nights as you to fill your room.

46 people are still on this trip, after some cancellations.

Pricina

Lodging (2 people per room) \$420/person for 6 or 7 nights (we get the 7th night free) \$350 for 5 nights \$280 for 4 nights.

For fewer than 6 nights, everyone in the room would need to have the same arrival and departure dates.

All lodging starts Sunday, March 13.

Some Snow-related Terms

Courtesy of Merriam-Webster, here's some unique winter weather vocab for you.

Névé

The partially compacted granular snow that forms the surface part of the upper end of a glacier. Also occasionally called firn. Originated from a word in the Swiss dialect of French and, before that, from the Latin word for snow, nix.

Skift. A light fall of rain or snow.

Onding. A heavy fall of rain or snow. Less than a blizzard but more than a normal snowfall. Used in Scotland and Northern England since the middle of the 18th century.

Graupel

Soft hail. The word has German origins and is the diminutive of the word for "pearl barley" (Graupe). Has been in use since the 1870s when meteorologists thought they needed to distinguish one kind of hail from another.

Corn Snow

Granular snow formed by alternate thawing and freezing. Also referred to as spring snow or simply corn. Came to use in the early 20th century.

Sposh

Soft or slushy snow. Thought to be a combination of the words slush and posh, posh being an archaic term that means "a slushy mass".

Firnification

The process whereby snow is changed to névé.

Spring Passes



A lot of ski areas are offering a Spring pass starting in March. Even the Indy Pass now has a Spring version. Note that ski areas don't usually even mention these Spring Passes until the start of March. But they are here now.

Spring passes are a great deal. For the cost of maybe just 2 or 3 day lift tickets, you can now ski for the next 3 months, March, April and May.

Mt. Hood Meadows Spring Pass.

Mt. Hood Meadows has moved its Spring Pass from early March to starting as of March 21, 2022. The Spring Pass is valid starting March 21 and is good for every day we are operational through the end of the 2021-22 winter recreation season

Price is \$249 for the 25-64 age bracket, \$229 for ages 65-74, \$199 for ages 7-24, \$29 for ages 6 and younger, and free for ages 75 and older. A limited number of passes will be offered. On sale already!

Timberline Spring Pass.

Timberline's Spring season lasts the longest - March, April and May.

Timberline hasn't announced its Spring pass prices yet, but they usually start selling right after the first weekend in March, which would be as of Monday, March 7. The Spring Pass is valid until May 30, 2022. Stay tuned and check out the prices at: <u>https://www.timberlinelodge.com/mountain/season-passes</u>.

Mt. Hood Skibowl Spring Pass.

Skibowl will not offer a Spring Pass this year.

Indy Spring Pass.

An Indy Spring pass, already on sale since March 1st, gives you 2 days access to 82 fantastic resorts through April 30th, 2022. Prices for the regular Indy Spring Pass are: Adults = \$189, Kids = \$79. If you want to purchase an Indy Plus Spring Pass with no blackout dates, the prices are: Indy+ Pass for adults = \$239, Kids Indy+ Pass = \$99.

Also, note that all Indy Spring Passholders will receive a 10% discount on 22/23 passes!

New 6-pack Lift at Mt. Hood Meadows

The Mt. Hood Meadows Express quad chairlift will be replaced with a 6-pack chairlift in the Summer of 2023.

The quad chair has been in place since 1994.

The new 6-pack will increase the lift capacity from 2,600 skiers/hour to 3,600 skiers/hour.

New Hiking Trails at Mt. Hood Meadows

Mt. Hood Meadows has 8 miles of new hiking trails constructed last summer (2021).

These trails can most easily be accessed from the Stadium chairlift, which will operate Thursdays thru Mondays during the Summer months.

A Winter season pass includes free access to Summer lift riding.

New High Speed Lift at 49° North

The 49 Degrees North ski area has installed a new high-speed quad chairlift to replace the old double chairlift to the top of the mountain.

The new lift is named "Northern Spirit Express".


