Spring Skiing? Hmm...



March, April, May. Spring skiing is characterized by warm, sunny days and somewhat icy, hard snow early in the morning. When the snow softens up in the sun, there is a magic hour, when the skiing is just perfect. Depending on the weather, this magic hour can happen around 10 am, or 11 am, or even around noon.

But even though it is already the beginning of April, it still feels like winter. The mountains are being pummeled by one snow-storm after another. The snow just keep coming.

Just as an example, on Saturday, April 1, 2023, Timberline has received 18 inches of new snow in the past 24 hours, for a

total base now standing at 176 inches. That is 14 feet and 8 inches. And more snow is in the forecast. The above image shows Timberline Lodge snowed in. (Sorry for the date, but this is NOT an April Fools' joke.)

Mt. Hood Meadows also received 18" of snow within the past day, for a total of 150 inches at the base area and 230 inches mid-mountain. That is 19 feet and 2 inches. And there seems to be no end to more snow.

This is great for powder seekers, but so much fresh snow also brings a danger of tree wells and avalanches. Also, low visibility increases the risk of getting disoriented and lost. So be careful. Don't ski alone and keep an eye on your ski buddies.

On the next few pages are some ideas on what to do this Spring in addition to your regular ski habits.

Ski the Canyons west of Timberline



Check out the scenery just a little bit west of Timberline and dip into some of the canyons. The terrain is easy when the snow is good. But not all canyons are safe and it's easy to get lost in the forest if you ski below the tree line.

Emilio knows this terrain well and wants to show you how to safely and legally ski in and out of the canyons and back to the ski lifts. Or how to ski all the way down to Government Camp.

Last Spring, we tried to do it every Saturday. But this year, we'll do it only once

or twice, and by invitation only. We already have a list of over a dozen people who have expressed interest. People on that list will be informed when the time comes. How to get on the list? THINGS TO KNOW. 1. The terrain is mostly intermediate. You can also choose your own level of challenge. Some steeper sections can easily be bypassed. Some easier sections also have a steeper alternative.

- 2. In the Spring, the deep snow settles under its own weight and then repeated cycles of freezing and thawing create a solid surface that can be even easier to ski than some groomed trails. But we received so much fresh snow lately that we need to wait until it solidifies, to make it both easier and safer.
- 3. The tour can be short, just 15 20 minutes, returning to the ski lifts. Or we can make the tour much longer, over an hour, and end up in Government Camp. and catch the Mt. Hood Express bus back.





Crystal Mountain (Washington) has great plans for renovation and expansion.

Mt. High Indy Pass & Our Trips



The Indy Pass has grown to well over 120 independent ski areas around the US, over 30 of them in the West. And it is continuing to grow.

Brundage Mountain has decided to drop out of all other passes and stay only on the Indy Pass.

Our club is planning to organize next season's ski trips to visit a number of Indy Pass ski areas, where skiing is free for 2 days at each of them.

Linda McGavin says: "I'll try to find something that includes both Mt. Hood Meadows passholders and the Indy Pass."

Many of us who have had the Indy Pass last season received a special discounted if we purchased next season's pass in March. So, many of us did.

The Indy Pass is now on sale to the general public. The basic pass costs \$319 (with some blackout dates) or \$419 without blackout dates.

Mt. Hood Meadows Pass holders can buy the Indy Pass as an add-on for just \$239.

So, get ready for next winter and buy your Indy Pass now. The number of passes is limited this year.


