The Liability Release form that we are often asked to sign, or that is printed on our lift tickets, is not always enforceable enough. See a video about this on page 8.

The Mountain Shop in Portland Moves to New Location

The Mountain Shop has already closed its location on 2975 NE Sandy Blvd. from September 1 - 4, 2025, to allow for enough time to move everything to the new location,

The new location will open on Friday, Septmeber 5, 2025, at **the corner of NE 33rd and Sandy**. It will have all the great gear we are used to seeing, plus a few more new brands and products. The new location also has an off-street parking lot on **NE 33rd**, which will make rental pickups super easy!

INDY PASS is on sale agin, for a short time

- Remember that both Brundage Mountain and Tamarack are on the INDY Pass, so the pass would b useful to you if you are planning on joing us on the McCall, Idaho ski trip.
- Also, Mt. Hood Meadows is on the INDY Pass, so if you don't have the Meadows Pass, you can still get 2 free days at Mt. Hood Meadows with the INDY Pass.
- Or, if you do have a Meadows Pass, you can purchase an INDY PASS as an add-on, for about \$100 less than its normal price, which is \$449 for all adults (with a few blackout dates) or \$599 without any blackout dates.
- The Indy Pass givees you 2 free ski days at over 270 ski areas.
- It is a very popular ass and it sells out quickly. They limit the number of passes sold in order to avoid crowds at member ski areas.
- It is now on sale for a few days. If you can't purchase it right now, at least get your name on **the waiting list**, because only those on the waiting list will be given one more chance to buy it later in the Fall. To buy it or find more info, go to their website: www.indyskipass.com/.

Grooming at Kicking Horse

At Kicking Horse, intensive brush work and shaping has been ongoing to help improve flow and access. The overall goal of this work is so more runs can be opened earlier in the season, especially on the lower mountain.

Castle Mountain adds new high-speed quad

Castle Mountain (Alberta) is installing their first high-speed quad lift called the Stagecoach Express, which they obtained from Banff Sunshine. This new lift will be installed on Mt. Haig, above the Huck-leberry chair, on the resort's existing cat skiing area and will open up 25% more lift-assisted skiable terrain. Find all the details at https://www.skicastle.ca/newlift/

Lake Louise Richardson's Ridge terrain expansion

Lake Louise is developing a new region called Richardson's Ridge, located on the backside of the resort and will be accessible from the Pika run. This area will include a new chairlift and new terrain for a variety of ability levels.

Summit Lake Ski Area gets the Ski Town Award for 2025 and \$5,000. Summit Lake, BC is located south of Revelstoke, and just 11.5 miles south of Nakusp. It is on high-

way 6, roughly half way between Vernon (Silver Star) and Nelson (Whitewater).


