

New Club Name



The most surprising thing is that most of our members abstained from voting. Maybe that means most people don't really care what we call the club, as long as we keep on skiing. Of those that did vote, the votes were:

Mountain High = 30 votes **Plaza/Edgeset** = 25 votes

As for the descriptive part of the name, people voted as follows:

Snowsport club = 19 votes (13 for the singular version, and 6 for the plurar "Snowsports")

Ski & Snowboard Club = 14 votes

Ski club = 11 votes

Snowriders club = 5 votes

It is intereting to note that the allinclusive descriptions seem to win over the less inclusive descriptions,

So, the winning name is: "**Mountain High Snowsport Club**". The new name will be gradually implemented over the next few months. The old name will be used in parallel with the new name for at least the next year, to ensure continuity. The logo shown here is only a first draft.

Interestingly, the one other time we had a vote regarding possibly renaming the club, two years ago, November 2001, only 12 people initially voted to keep the Plaza/Edgeset name, while over 30 others voted to rename the club, but were split among dozens of different names. A month later, when we narrowed down the field to just 3 finalists, the counts were 19, 16, and 3 votes, with Plaza/Edgeset winning over the two others, and most people abstaining from the vote.




