

Safety Message

from Jodie Dierickx



As snow enthusiasts, we all get frustrated every now and then with other people's behavior and values. It occurred to me that we often assume everyone up on the mountain knows the "Rules of Responsibility" but that may not be a good assump-

tion. Hence, I thought it would helpful to publish the 7 rules of responsibility for all of us up enjoying the snow:

Your Responsibility Code

Skiing/snowboarding can be enjoyed in many ways. At ski areas you may see people using alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross country and other specialized ski equipment, such as that used by disabled or other skiers. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show **courtesy** to others and be aware that there are elements of **risk** in skiing or boarding that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Observe **the code** listed below and share with other skiers and boarders the responsibility for a great experience.

- 1. Always stay in control.
- **2.** People ahead of you have the right of way.
- **3.** Stop in a safe place for you and others. (NOT just over a crest where others can't see you or in the middle of a narrow area)
- **4.** Whenever starting downhill or merging, look uphill and yield.
- **5.** Use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- **6.** Observe signs and warnings, and keep off closed trails.
- 7. Know how to use the lifts safely.

KNOW THE CODE. IT'S YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.

Sport clothing often uses bold colors. Ducks fans use yellow and green liberally. Red Sox fans decorate their garments with plenty of red. So, why are we skiers limitted to just plain black pants? Since the advent of snowboarding, we have two other colors available: tan or gray. How exciting is that?



I have nothing against black or gray, but why not add a colorful accent somewhere? This is supposed to be clothing for fun, not for a funeral!

Finally, after almost 15 years of boring black, we are getting some exciting new designs in ski clothing, and it's coming from right here in Oregon. **Airtime** gear is made in **Hood River**.

I bought new ski pants and a jacket off the rack,

and it comes with red, yellow, or blue accents. Other colors are available, and they can customize your jacket or pants by adding extra pockets or whatever else you might need.

The material used is high-tech Xalt 2- or 3-layer composite material, with a water-proof, breathable windproof film and a micro-fabric layer with Durepel finish. The pants have dual zippers along the sides, so you can open them partially (for ventillation). Also, they have two sets of buckles with adjustable straps (on each side of the waist),



so you can cinch them up as tight as you need.

Other designs are available too. They also have vests and more. So, be a patriot. Buy US made!
