Club ride: Providence Bridge Pedal 2004



August 8 (Sunday) 7:00 am. You say you have always wanted to make the Bridge Pedal, but do not have anyone to ride with and would like to go with someone with some experience.

Well here is your chance. Larry Bennett, Joe Pollock and Terry White are willing to act as your guides. Come and take a leisurely ride over some of Portland's magnificent bridges. Larry and Terry will ride with those wanting to make the full 24 mile loop. Joe will lead the shorter 14 mile family ride. We will stop and check out the views, take advantage of photo-opps and visit with friends along the way. Here's how:

1) Call **Larry** (503)760-2360 so we know you are coming. Larry can arrange for group registration, at \$16 per person. If you register on your own, it's \$20.

- 2) To apply on your own (by July 31), applications are available at most bike shops and all Providence facilities. Or, apply online by August7 at www.providence.org/ rosepedal. Mark your application for the 7:30 a.m. start, even those only going the short ride, so we all start together and stay together for the first part.
- 3) We'll meet in the parking lot of **Lloyd Athletic Club** and be ready to ride at 7:00 a.m. Lloyd Athletic Club is located at N.E. 7th, between N.E. Weidler and N.E. Halsey. Then we will be ready for a fun enjoyable ride.
- 4) Do not forget your **helmet**. No helmet, no ride. You might want to bring extra water. There are plenty of water/ refreshment stops and potty stops, also. Check your bike and be sure all is in working order; some of the approaches to the bridges can be steep and will require you to get to those lower gears. No need to do any training - I said this will be a fun leisurely ride. -Terry White
