

Sure maybe a year or two old, but ski boots don't change. These boots are as good as they were the day they were made! Even the most expensive ski boots in the store were under \$200.

During the meeting, the Next Adventure staff told us they will soon have snow-park permits available in their store, just as a convenience to their customers - with no extra surcharge.






Movie: Journey to the Source

Armonica was born Feb. 11, 1951 in Seattle. She was a graduate of the University of Denver Law School and worked as an assistant attorney general for the Oregon Department of Justice in the 1990s.

Eventually, music became more important to her than law, she found her passion and became an accomplished Jazz singer. She sang in Portland jazz clubs, had made one CD and was working on her second.

She embraced skiing with equal passion and became a Level 2 ski instructor, spending her winters teaching in Vail (see photo).

She was in Utah, driving to see her father, when she had a car accident. After surgery on her foot, she had an embolism that killed her on Oct. 4, 2005. She was 54. Our condolences to Allen, and to all who knew her.



All three have a variety of terrain, from easy cruisers to great tree skiing!



Five-member teams will have 2 races at Mt. Hood Meadows. Our club has participated in this event for years. It is fun, and for a good cause, to help the fight cancer and raise funds for hospice care for cancer victims.

Mt. High Ski Safari to Canada





Nov. 24 - **28/29** (Thur. - Mon. or Tue.)

At least 9 people are planning to do this around Thanksgiving. 3 or 4 people will do this around Dec. 8-12,

and at least 4 pople are planning it for April.

This is an informal, 5 or 6-day road trip. We'll ski a different area every day. We'll start on Wednesday afternoon, after work, and drive abt. 4.5 hours to Bellingham, WA. The next day, on Thanksgiving, we'll ski at **Mt. Baker.** Then drive abt 5 hours to Sun Peaks, near Kamloops, in Canada.

From there, it's only a 2 hour drive between any 2 ski areas. We'll stay in the ski-in/ski-out mountain village. Arrive in the evening, jump in the hot-tub, have dinner, sleep, then ski the area the next day. At the end of the day, we'll drive to the next resort. On day 5 (Mon.), those who want to get home that same evening will ski at Apex only till noon, and then drive home, arriving in Portland by abt. 10 pm.

Those who can spare one more day, can enjoy Apex all day, then drive just 4 hours south to Wenatchee, and ski at **Mission Ridge** the next day. Then drive home, arriving by about 9 or 10 pm on Tuesday.

Reservations are not needed. There are no crowds this early in the season. Besides, most hotels at the resorts require a 2-night minimum stay. So, you can't reserve just one night. But, if you just show up, and they have free rooms, they'll let us stay a night. If not, we can always find a motel in a nearby town.

This is one of the cheapest ski trips ever, since a lot of the skiing is free, and we share the costs of lodging and gas. Estimate: ab.t \$300 for 6 days/6 nights.
