Mt. High Hike to Hawk Mountain with Elisabeth Mt. High



June 25 Sunday, 8:30 am

Let's go to Hawk Mountain!

Moderate 10,4 miles round-trip. 1,380 feet elevation gain.

When fire lookoout towers dotted the summits of hundreds of Cascade peaks in the 1940s, only a few staffers had the luxury of sleeping in a seperate ground level building. Even fewer of these rustic cabins remain today. The remote Rho Ridge Trail leads to Hawk Mt. rare lookout cabin and stunning, close-up view of **Mt. Jefferson**. The Ridge was named for the rhododendrons that bloom here in June.

This sounds so wonderful! Chuck and I tried to do this hike recently, found many obstacles, and got lost. There was snow and wildlife! It was too late to start the hike when we finally found the trailhead.

The drive to Graham Pass is outstanding, along the Clackamas River. I have a friend who did this hike years ago and will join us on the hike.

Newsletter options



If you receive the newsletter via email, you now have the option to either:

- A) Recive the complete PDF file, as usual; or
- B) Receive just a short email containing a link to the PDF file on our web site.

What's the difference? Not much.The download time is the same, since it is the same

PDF file. For those who have broadband (hi-speed) access, it doesn't make much difference. But, if you have a slow connection, the main question is: when do you want to wait for the file to download?

With **option A**, the wait is up front, when your email is dowloaded to your computer. When you get the email, you automatically get the attached newsletter.

With option B, you first get a short email, asking you to click on the link. The wait time will happen only if and when you clik on that link. So far, only 9 people have requested this option (just the link).

If you wish to change, let **Emilio** know your preference.

Ski Trips Survey

Mt. High

We asked you about your preferences, and here's what you told us about possible longer ski trips:

HOW LONG: I generally prefer this many days:

HIGH

3 days: **9** people 4 days: 16 people

5 days: 19 people

6 days: 8 people

7 days: **11** people 8 days: 6 people

LODGING: I generally prefer to stay in:

[a hotel]: **5** people [a condo]: 19 people [no preference]: 12 people [a hostel]: **2** people

If anyone selected a range, such as 4-5 days, a vote was added to both the 4-day and the 5-day option.

SNOWSPORT

Looks like the majority prefers 4-5 days, or a

full week (7 days).

Most prefer a condo. Few voted for a hotel. But many **don't** really care either way.

One person voted for a condo: "Because you can **cook**!" So, it looks like our members like to cook after a full day on the slopes! Of course, this may be cheaper, except for any uneaten food left behind or thrown away at the end of the trip.

LOCATION: I prefer the following lodging location:

[a] **On-mountain**, near or at the slopes, even if there are few eateries = **27** people

[b] In town, within 30-45 min. from slopes, but close to restaurants and bars = 4 people

[c] No preference. Either of the above is fine. = 6 people.

Interesting. It does appear that people care more about **skiing** than **eating out**.

HOW MUCH ON-SNOW TIME: On a **5 day trip**, I want to ski this many days:

3 days: **11** people 4 days: 22 people 5 days: **12** people

So, **most** people like to skip **one** day of skiing. Those who prefer to ski all 5 days are just slightly more numerous than those who would skip 2 days of skiing. Nobody voted to skip more than 2 days.

* ACTIVITIES: On a 5 day trip, my preferred fun activities (not counting happy hour or dinner):

[a] **Downhill skiing (or snowboarding)** is my main interest. = **34** (that's almost everyone)

[b] I'd try other outdoor activities (X-country, ice-skating) 1-2 days cross-country skiing = 2 people. [c] I'd take the following number of days for **off-slope activities** such as shopping, sightseeing, visiting a spa

1 days: 12 people 2 days: **5** people

This sounds reasonable. Some people would like to devote at least 1 day to something other than skiing.

❖ UTAHTRIP (Powder Mt./Snowbasin): Specifically for this next upcoming trip, 16 of you are interested, 5 are not sure. But many of you did not notice this question on the back side of the Survey sheet. Also, some of those 16 are responses given by one spouse speaking on behalf of the couple. So, the total number on this trip will be larger. For the shorter version of this trip, 9 people voted for 4 days, and an equal number voted for 5 days.

Ski Oregon Challenge



The idea to challenge snowriders to visit all of Oregon's ski areas came from **Steve Coxen**, in cooperation with the **Northwest Ski Club Council** and the **Oregon Snowsport Industries Association**. See more at: www.nwskiers.org.

The idea was widely advertised through local ski clubs and on the NWSCC and OSIA web sites, but few people actually completed the challenge by visiting all 11 ski areas. Having a season ski pass to just one resort was definitely a hindrance in this situation. For now, we know of 3 successful challengers, though others may surface in time.



1. **David Schor** did it on a **snowboard**, and was the first one to visit all the areas. He completed the task before the end of February. And this was his first full year of snowboarding!



2. **McCoy Smith** did it on **telemark skis** as well as **alpine** skis, and also purchased an item at every ski area! That's a Spout Springs hat he has on.



3. Emilio Trampuz did it on mid-fat alpine skis, and took lots of photos.

Let us know if you did at least 9 ski areas, and we'll add you to the list.

The adventure took us to places we had not visited before. Most of them were very pleasant surprises. The result is that we are now determined to go back and re-visit at least some of these places next year. Not only that, but, we hope some of the rest of you will join us!

Can people find us on the web? Google - the worst

HIGH

This is an update of last year's article. We re-tested all the search engines, using the following search words: **Portland ski club**. We found that MSN has improved greatly, and we now rank among the top 3 or 4

results on every search engine except Google and AOL.

Google keeps changing the rules. For most of the past year, we were invisible on Google. After some tweaking of our web site, Google



finally found us, but it moves us around all the time. During a 3 week period in May/June 2006, we were listed in position 19, 20, 21, or 25.

It's no good if we are burried under hundreds of other similar "finds". Ideally, we should be found in the top 10 results. Here's how our club was ranked by the various search engines (from best to worst):

Google is, unfortunately, the most popular search engine, probably because not many people are aware that its results have been sub-par duirng the last year, and especially bad since early Spring of 2006.

Is Google incompetent or is it doing this on purpose?

Google tightened its rules to stop those who were abusing internet searches, but in doing so, it went overboard and is now hurting innocent people like us.

Another explanation is that Google is now a public company, looking primarily for quick profit, and thus gives unfair advantage to those web sites who pay them for a better listing.

Fortunately it is also possible to find our club indirectly, via some other web sites that list us, such as the **NWSCC** web site, or **SkiSite.com**.

There might be a trip to Big Sky in 2008, but we are still not sure about 2007.






- 1. Mission Ridge, with a new express lift installed last season. Ski by a World War II bomber that crashed on the mountain!

hundreds) of ski clubs throughout the Western States (OR, WA, ID, NV, CA, AZ, NM). See the FWSA web site: www.fwsa.org.

62 spots reserved for Northwest skiers.

The phrase "champagne powder snow" was coined at Steamboat. 
